HOT TAMALE AND X-RATED ELECTED TO MINIATURE AND MINIFLORA ROSE HALL OF FAME

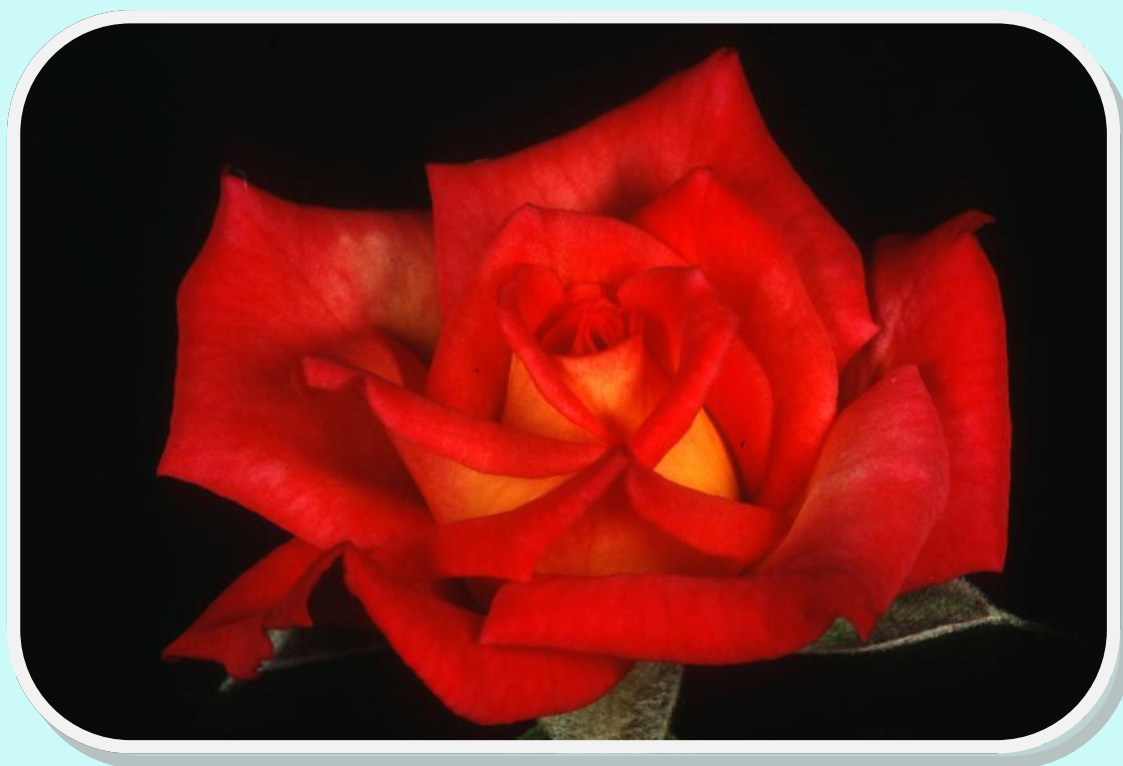

Since its creation in 1999, the Miniature and Miniflora Rose Hall of Fame has honored those miniatures and minifloras that have stood the test of time in commerce for at least 20 years, recognizing excellence and longevity. Each year a “Call for Nominations” is printed in *American Rose*, posted on the ARS website and distributed to bulletin editors. This year 240 nominations were received from 57 rosarians, and 56 different varieties were nominated. The ARS Miniature/Miniflora Rose Committee determines the honoree(s) from the nominations submitted. Since 1998 there have been 31 miniature and miniflora roses inducted into the Hall of Fame.

At the 14th ARS National Miniature Conference in Columbus, Ohio on July 28th, two 2012 Miniature and Miniflora Rose Hall of Fame honorees were announced. The first, ‘**Hot Tamale**’, was hybridized by Dr. Keith Zary, and the second, ‘**X-Rated**’, by Dee Bennett.

‘**Hot Tamale**’ (‘JACpoy’) is a yellow blend miniature with yellow-orange blooms changing to yellow pink and finishing pink. The blooms have high centers and are borne singly and in small clusters. She has slight fragrance and small dark green semi-glossy foliage. Her eye catching color and good exhibition form draw attention on the show table and in the garden. ‘**Hot Tamale**’ was a 1994 AOE winner and introduced by Bear Creek Gardens in 1994. This is Dr. Keith Zary’s first introduction to enter the Hall of Fame.

‘X-Rated’ (‘TINx’) is a pink blend miniature with 26-40 petals which was hybridized by Dee Bennett and introduced by Tiny Petals Nursery in 1994. Her blooms are creamy white with edges which blush a soft coral to pink and are borne mostly singly. She has small semi-glossy medium green foliage. **‘X-Rated’** is an excellent exhibition rose, and her vigorous growth habit and floriferousness makes her an outstanding garden rose. Her parentage is (‘Tiki’ x ‘Baby Katie’). This is Dee Bennett’s fifth Hall of Fame honoree.

2013 AWARD OF EXCELLENCE WINNERS

In 1973 the American Rose Society Board of Directors established the Award of Excellence to recognize new miniature and miniflora rose varieties of superior quality and marked distinction. Since the inception of the Award, there have been 119 AOE winners.

This year, for the first time, miniature and miniflora roses which have been in commerce for less than one year, as well as unnamed seedlings or sports, were eligible for evaluation for two years in ten AOE public test gardens, spaced geographically across the United States. Each public garden has an AOE supervisor and five evaluators who score the entries on eleven criteria four times during each growing season. At the end of the trial period, Awards of Excellence are given to deserving entries, with a maximum of five per year. The test gardens are: American Rose Center, Shreveport, LA; Edisto Memorial Gardens, Orangeburg, SC; Elizabeth Park Rose Garden, Hartford, CT; Farmers Branch Public Rose Garden, Farmers Branch, TX; Hershey Gardens, Hershey, PA; International Rose Test Garden, Portland, OR; Mesa Community College Garden, Phoenix, AZ; Rose Hills Memorial Park, Whittier, CA; Toledo Botanical Gardens, Toledo, OH; and Virginia Clemens Rose Garden, St. Cloud, MN.

The official public announcement of the Award of Excellence winners is made each year at the awards banquet of the ARS National Miniature Rose Show and Conference. After two years of evaluation three Award of Excellence winners were selected. The three 2013 AOE winners announced in Columbus, Ohio on July 28, 2012 are **‘Diamond Eyes’** and **‘You’re the One’** by Tom Carruth and **‘Whimsy’** by Christian Bedard.

‘Diamond Eyes’ (‘WEKwibypur’)

This mysteriously novel “black-purple” miniature with a white “eye” and a strong clove spice fragrance immediately attracts your attention. Its sparkling white “eye” lights up each velvety blossom, making the unique color illuminate against the background of glossy green foliage. It has very good disease resistance and about 25 petals. This is the fourth AOE winner for hybridizer Tom Carruth. Parentage is ‘**Wild Blue Yonder**’ x [(seedling x ‘**Baby Love**’) x ‘**Night Owl**’], and it will be introduced by Weeks Roses.

‘You’re the One’ (‘WEKtaclagoma’)

This award winner goes great guns in the garden and has perfectly miniature-sized hybrid tea shaped buds of cream which open very formally with several blushing shades of pink. Disease resistance is good, and petal count is 20 to 25. Beyond the show table this baby will knock ‘em dead in the landscape with a bushy flowerful plant. There are loads of deep glossy green leaves providing the perfect background for the ever-changing show of plentiful pinkness. It was hybridized by Tom Carruth and is his fifth AOE winner. Parentage is ‘**Santa Claus**’ x ‘**Goldmarie**’, and it will be introduced by Weeks Roses.

‘Whimsy’ (‘WEKtebodoko’)

Christian Bedard’s fourth AOE winner in the last four years, this youngster will grab your attention with its super bushy habit that cranks out flowers with no lack of restraint. “Dad” (‘**Double Knock Out**’) lends a notable addition of better disease resistance in minis, and “Mom” (‘**Teeny Bopper**’) gives floriferousness, flower form and novel color. Each bloom is different – painted and splashed hot pink on creamy white – good enough to hit the show table and pretty enough to pluck for a boutonniere. Petal count is around 25, and it is definite landscape material for even the most restricted garden space. To be introduced by Weeks Roses.

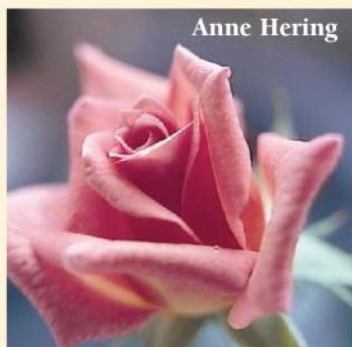

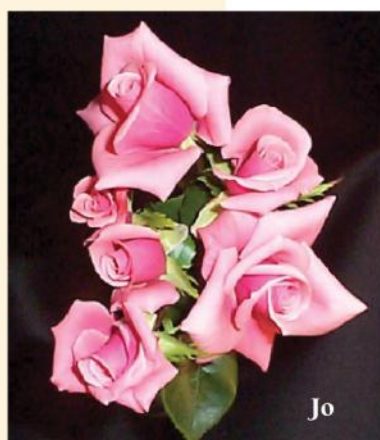
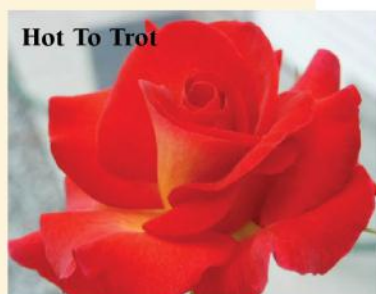

Remembering Mitchie Moe... And Her Rose Journey



It is with great sadness that I bring you the following news; the rose world lost a dear friend on June 9, 2012. Mitchie Moe succumbed to a courageous 10 year battle against cancer. When diagnosed, Mitchie was given just a short period to live. But Mitchie was a fighter, not a quitter and she tried every treatment her doctor could administer. Mitchie will forever be remembered for who she was, her rose knowledge, her enthusiasm about growing roses, and to share that knowledge and enthusiasm with others. But most of all she will be remembered for her gorgeous miniatures and minifloras she hybridized for all of us to enjoy forever. Many of the over 33 hybrids she hybridized she named after friends she made over the years from the rose world. Those would include, but are not limited to, 'Anne Hering,' 'Baldo Villegas,' 'Barbara,' 'Becky Adams,' 'Jo,' 'Judie,' 'Lynn,' 'Marilyn Wellan,' and 'Mike Peterson,' to name a few. She also hybridized 'Mitchie's Gold,' which was one of her pride and joys. It's a fabulous deep yellow miniature that won a number of "Queen of Miniature" in various rose shows. But the rose that is dear to the Seattle Rose Society is 'Seattle Sunrise,' an apricot blend miniflora which she introduced for our 2006 American Rose Society Spring National Convention. Six years later, we still use its likeness in the form of a watermark on our trophy cards at our annual rose show.

Mitchie's fascination with roses goes back to her childhood in Japan. Her neighbor had a big deep pink rambler that was breathtaking to Mitchie with its beauty and aroma. She could smell its fragrance all around her home. The rambler hung over the fence and on occasion, she would sneak and pick a bouquet for her mother. Mitchie would take its petals and place them between pages of a book so she "could enjoy the aroma long after the growing season was over."

In 1985, Mitchie and her husband John moved into a home that had three rose bushes. She didn't know their names but in 1986 she joined the Tacoma Rose Society. John was busy with Boy Scouts and their meetings were the same night of TRS's meetings. Attending rose

meetings rekindled Mitchie's childhood love and interest in growing roses. She entered three roses in the Novice section in 1988 at the Tacoma Show and she won the Best Novice with a floribunda spray of 'Montana.' Consequently, this caused her to catch the "rose growing bug." Mitchie now wanted to learn everything she could about growing roses. She learned that growing roses "is not a science, but an art that takes a lot of practice as well as a little bit of luck."



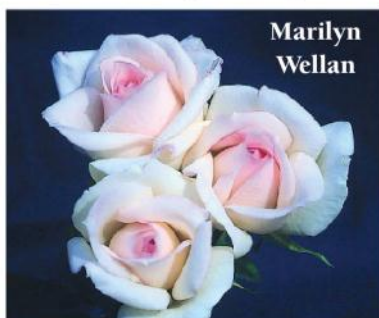
By 1989 or so, Mitchie and John's rose garden had grown to several hundred bushes. Mitchie was given a miniature rose plant by the name of 'Dee Bennett' as a welcome gift when she joined the American Rose Society. When it bloomed, for the first time, Mitchie thought it was the loveliest rose she had ever seen. This is when her love affair



with miniature roses began. She acquired more minis and began exhibiting them not just at local shows, but shows throughout the Pacific Northwest District, at PNW District Shows and at many National Shows.

Mitchie met Dr. Neil Adams in the early 1990's at a rose show

in Olympia. Dr. Adams was an amateur rose hybridizer from Chehalis, Washington and told Mitchie that after winning trophies, one day she would find hybridizing the next challenge. In 1993 the Pacific Northwest Rose Hybridizing Group was established with the help of Steve McCulloch and seven charter members. Hybridizing didn't come easy and Mitchie had her difficulties getting seeds to germinate. But with her perseverance and patience she succeeded. Her efforts were directed towards hybridizing a miniature that would be vigorous



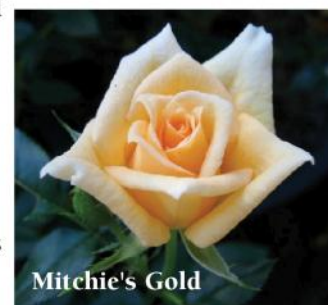
as well as disease resistant. As mentioned above, Mitchie introduced over 33 hybrids. She introduced micro-miniatures with names of 'Dot Com' and 'Mighty Moe,' and miniatures named 'Alpha Moe,' 'Ichiro,' and 'Cougar,' a miniflora named 'Hot To Trot,' as well as a floribunda named 'Anna Milam,' a grandiflora named 'Jan and Rick,' and a shrub by the name of 'Margaret H.'



Mitchie was honored for her love of roses, her ability to teach what she knew, and her general involvement to local societies and the Pacific Northwest District by being awarded

the Bronze Medal from the Valley Rose Society (1998) and from the Tacoma Rose Society (2011) and the Pacific Northwest District Silver Honor Medal in 2007. Mitchie was an instructor at numerous judging schools and Consulting Rosarian Schools. She was an Accredited Rose Judge, an Arrangement Judge, a Master Rosarian and the PNW District co-Consulting Rosarian Chair. She was always there to help, to give encouragement, and to teach people that growing roses doesn't need to be difficult. Mitchie will be greatly missed, especially this rose season.

Ernest Hemingway defined courage as "grace under pressure." Throughout Mitchie's 10 year battle with cancer she persevered with equanimity, humor, and grace under pressure giving life to Hemingway's classic definition of courage. Her courage, grace and good fellowship has been an inspiration for those of us privileged to have known her, to work with her, and to love her.
